Dear Friends,

Bill celebrated his 73rd Birthday. We had a breakfast at church that morning. They included a cake and decorated for his birthday along with the breakfast. The Alvorada church is in the final process of getting the title to the church property. It has taken almost a year after starting the process. We have two church parsonages which need to be legalized but they tell us it won't take as long.

Pastor Francisco Eloia now pastors the church in Caracarai. The church asked him to take the leadership and then at the elections in December voted him in as pastor. The pastor's wife Gecelita grew up in the church when we started there. They both graduated from the Bible Institute in Caracarai and have been serving there. Gecelita remembers the activities and things we did with the children and teens during her youth, and she is using some of those ideas once again at the church. Both are teachers in the public school. Pray for the church and that they can increase in attendance after Covid and death of several members.

He said at the end of his message that we have been married 51 years and 50 years as missionaries in Brazil. We have taught and preached the Message of the Cross all these years and have seen the change in people's lives when they accept Christ and follow Him.

Sunday morning, we had breakfast at the church and then Pastor Francisco preached. (He had helped us at the Bible Baptist Church in another neighborhood and helped in all the church constructions. He lives in Manaus, Amazonas.) Sunday night some of the church people read verses presenting the message that Christ died for you and for me. Pastor Sebastião, member of the church in Caracarai, preached and we had a good attendance. From the 5 churches that we started over these years someone was present from each of these churches. Praise God!

April 16 - Wedding in Caracarai - We traveled 2 hours by car Caracarai to attend the wedding of a young lady that we have known since she was a little girl. She grew up in the church and still helps teach a Sunday School class. She is studying to be a nurse and loves working with children. Both her and her husband are musical and play instruments for the church services.

June 13, 2022 to November 9, 2022 we will be in the States for a short furlough. We will be attending the Mission Conference at Worth Baptist Church, September 7-11. We are looking forward to being with our sending church. They invited us last year, but we were not able to make the trip. We plan to be at the IBFI Fall Fellowship meeting in October in Canton, Michigan. We are looking forward to seeing Pastors, Missionaries and Friends at this meeting. 


