We received the Manancial church document from the Mayor's Office so we thought we were done. **No!!** We had to go to the Notary's Office and they said they needed Photo documents of the past two Presidents of our Brazilian Mission. We finally got those papers. Now waiting to have whoever is in charge to sign the title. We started this process 2 years ago. We still have one more parsonage to get documents but hopefully it won't take as long.

October 11-13 - We drove 2 hours by car to attend the 46th Anniversary of the Bible Baptist Church in Caracarai. They served a meal for all the church people. We visited with the people and had a good time of fellowship. I even got to hold the twin boys Gustão and Gustava. They are 7 months old now. Children's day in Brasil is the 12th of October. The churches use this date to invite the children to come and play games and hear a Bible Lesson. Here are some of the children.
