So far, they are averaging twelve in the meetings. If you are able to help, the following items are needed: bottled water, shoes, socks, insect spray, and hand sanitizer.
- *Mark and Tricia Haynes (Navajo Nation) report a good turnout of men for their men's retreat. The VBS ministries were well attended. The Ganado Baptist Church VBS had an average attendance of 104 and 8 came to Christ! The VBS at Strong Hold Baptist Church had an average of 125 with 23 coming to Christ! The VBS at Chambers Baptist Church had an average in the 70's with 24 trusting Christ! The Navajo Nation Cowboy Revival saw 2 folks saved.
- *Darrain and Mari Coker (Mexico) report a recent three day youth camp where there were Bible lessons, preaching, games, and lots of food! Children's Day at church was celebrated with a special children's program. It was also celebrated at a small community outside of town called El Rancho Viejo where thirty-eight children and several adults heard the Gospel. This is an outreach ministry point. The church just celebrated it's 6th anniversary.
- *Daniel and Tammy Coates (Guatemala) rejoice in those who are recently saved and baptized! The church celebrated Mother's Day with a special service and dinner at the church in La Esperanza. Bro.
