On Our Way to the Uttermost

"But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth."

The progression of our witness for Christ in Acts 1:8 has a very definite progression - beginning in our home town Jerusalem, we then move on to the rest of our country, Judaea. The progression ends with the uttermost part of the earth. Christ is Savior and "all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God." Isaiah 52:10. But, on our way to the uttermost part of the earth, we encounter a strange and complicated place, Samaria.

Samaria represents a people group that while near to us geographically, even in our own country, is separated from us by barriers much more powerful than mere distance. Samaria represents the unreached people groups that, if we walk in the flesh, we don't really want to reach. But praise God! - We don't have to walk in the flesh; we can walk in the Spirit of God.

*Larry and Regina McKinney (N.A. Indians) request continue prayer for the water shortage they are having on the reservation. The ministry work on the Spokane Reservation continues to go forward. The McKinney's request prayer for laborers to help in the great need to reach the Indians on the reservations.

*Harold and Lena Priday (Honduras) report the church members are growing in the Lord. Several are serving in various church ministries. The Priday's report 38 in attendance for the national Children's Day special program at the mission work.

*Darrain and Mari Coker (Mexico) report a great Father's Day service at the Mount Sinai Baptist Mission. They had a high of 28 kids for VBS at the church and 40 children at the outreach community of el Rancho Viejo.

*Mark and Tricia Haynes (Navajo Nation) worked in several VBS this summer. In the Low Mountain community VBS, there was an average of 93 in attendance with 30 coming to Christ. The Haynes' helped with the VBS at Crownpoint Baptist Church where 22 came to Christ. At the Navajoland Baptist Revival there were 300 in attendance.
