After the Brook Dries Up

"And many of the children of Israel shall he turn to the Lord their God." Luke 1:16

Imagine you are in the perfect will of God. You are doing exactly what God asked you to do, in the exact location God led you to, and God has provided your every need - then the brook dries up. That is what happened in 1 Kings 17 to Elijah near the beginning of his ministry, and it can happen to you too.

In this amazing piece of history, God introduces us to Elijah the prophet. A bold and faithful messenger of the Almighty God during a time of national apostasy, idolatry and persecution. He was the example to John the Baptist of whom it was said by the angel of the Lord: "And he shall go before him in the spirit and power of Elias (Elijah), to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just; to make ready a people prepared for the Lord." Elijah heard the Word of the Lord and faithfully obeyed and proclaimed it. To Ahab, King of Israel, it was a Word of God's judgement. "No dew nor rain these years, but according to my word." Famine would result. To Elijah, it was the three-fold command; "get thee hence, and turn thee eastward, and hide thyself by the brook Cherith." There Elijah would find water and food. To the ravens, God's Word was to feed Elijah there at the brook.

In time, *the brook dried up*." God's Word to Elijah was again three-fold; "*Arise, get thee to Zarephath, which belongeth to Zidon, and dwell there*." To the widow woman at Zarephath, God's Word was for her to sustain Elijah. Zarephath was in Zidon where Jezebel's father was King and Baal was worshiped. In a time of national crisis, God sent Elijah to the mission field. For three years, Ahab searched the nations and kingdoms for Elijah. And all of that time, Elijah was perfectly safe and secure in the place of service where God had sent him.

God's commands are astonishingly simple. To obey them does not require any great ability, strength, or miracles - only obedience. Elijah obeyed God and went; the ravens did what God commanded. But the widow woman had fears and reservations. Whatever faith she had in God needed growth. She feared she couldn't sustain herself or her son in the famine. How could she obey God and provide for this stranger Elijah? Her first choice was to ignore God's command, keep what little she had for her family, and starve to death. She needed some encouragement from Elijah, and he assured her that God's blessings would follow her obedience. When she obeyed God and did what was in her capacity to do, then God did what was in His capacity to do. Miracles began to be a daily part of her life.

God has given us some commands also. We find them in the Bible. Some obey God immediately. Sometimes we have fears and reservations. Sometimes we decide to follow our own plans instead. Elijah's advice applies to us today. "*Fear not: go and do as thou hast said:*" *but first* do what God commanded you to do. When everyone in the Church does what God has told them to do, **then** we will see God do some amazing things in our lifetime.

Your faith can spread to the most unlikely people and your life can have an eternal impact for God after the brook dries up.
