Some of the things we deal with are coping with cultural conflicts or the way things are done here (i.e. when the church service starts at 6 pm people don't leave home until then). Our state of Nuevo Leon is the third worst for crime, drugs, car thieves, murders, & the black market of cars & people. The police are corrupt and deal on the black market. Drugs are widespread. The army & federal police are present most of the time on the streets. We don't go out alone or stay out late. You always have to watch your money because they'll shortchange you in change or what you are buying. We also have to deal with Jehovah Witnesses, Mormons & Pentacostalists.

According to the Boston Globe, in December of 2006, Mexico's new President Felipe Calderón declared war on the drug cartels, reversing earlier government passiveness. Since then, the government has made some gains, but at a heavy price - gun battles, assassinations, kidnappings, fights between rival cartels, and reprisals have resulted in over 9,500 deaths since December 2006 - over 5,300 killed last year alone. In Nuevo León, our state, we have had our share of troubles including several skirmishes between the army and drug cartels in San Nicolás (where we live) and on the highway between Monterrey and Reynosa (which Continued on Next Page . . .

They give tips on how to avoid and confront from carjackings to being kidnapped and armed robbery to muggings. The drug and law enforcement confrontation has begat many who are trying to profit from all of the confusion. On one side, there are those who offer "protection" and on the other side, those who try to extort and swindle. We are in a current special "week of prayer" in our church because of all of the violence that is occurring around us. Many of our people have been threatened by phone and two members at one time were kidnapped, one by a local group of extortionists and the other by a drug group. We ask that you join us in prayer for our safety and the safety of our people and churches. As far as I know, none of the missionaries have been in any real danger up to this time, but things could get out of hand real soon. We are taking precautions to keep a low level, like changing daily routines and routes for transport, and not giving public financial disclosures at the church as to how the treasury is. In spite of all of this, there is good news. We will continue to knock on doors, reach out to the lost, baptize believers, and teach nationals until the Lord tells us to go elsewhere. Many are participating in praying and more are out soul-winning than usual. There is a prospect of being able to buy or rent some land that would enable us not to have to build an underground parking for the new building we plan to build! Brethren, pray for us!
