

On the Wings of Prayer

"Children, have ye any meat?"

Many lessons are taught by Jesus' miracle of the multiplying the bread and fish. The lesson of God's provision applies to the ministry almost daily. Jesus saw the hunger of the great multitude and brought it to the attention of His disciples. "Whence shall we buy bread, that these may eat?" Their response seems quite valid. The need is far too great for our meager resources. Thus inaction seems justified. And then Jesus got personal and asks, "How many loaves have ye?" It did not matter how many loaves they had nor how great the need. Jesus wanted to meet the need, and he wanted to use the disciples and what they had to meet the need. Here is the simple process that Jesus used that day.

- 1. They brought what they had to Jesus.
- 2. The people were made to sit down.
- 3. Jesus blessed and divided their meager resources.
- 4. While the disciples used what they had to meet the need, God multiplied.
- 5. Afterwards, they had more than they started with and the need was met.

Then in John 6:35 he answers his own question that the disciples could not answer. "I am the bread of life." He was then and He still is. He is still the answer. Have ye any meat?
