A COVENANT WITH GOD

time around the year 2000 B.C., there lived a man by the name of Terah in a place called the Ur of the Chaldees. This was a part of the land area known as Mesopotamia, the "land between two rivers," the Tigris and Euphrates. Designated the cradle civilization. of this land was

prominent in biblical geography as well as in the development of secular history in subsequent years.

Terah fathered a baby boy and called him Abram. Although the name Abram means "high and exalted father," one wonders if Terah ever dreamed of the exalted status to which his son would be elevated in God's economy—just a tiny little baby, but one who would become not only the father of many nations but a friend of God and a prince among men.

After the developmental years of childhood and youth, Abram assumed the responsibility of manhood and took a wife named Sarai. Then came their move from Ur of the Chaldees to the land of Haran, a stopover on the way to Canaan, the "Promised Land" of hope, happiness, and home (Gen. 11).

It was after the death of Terah that the saga of Abram's life begins, the first segment of which is characterized by a visit from the Lord.

The Abrahamic Covenant

In obedience to God's instructions to leave his father's household, his family, and his favored homeland, Abram journeys to Canaan. The record of his journey is found in Genesis 12 where we learn also that God had assured Abram of the following blessings to be included in the Abrahamic Covenant:

Enlightenment: "I will shew thee" (12:1).

Enlargement: "I will make of thee a great nation (12:2).

Endowment: "I will bless thee" (12:2). **Enhancement:** "I will ... make thy name great" (12:2)

Encouragement: "I will bless them that bless thee" (12:3).

Entitlement: "In thee shall all families of the earth be blessed (12:3)

Enrichment: "Unto thy seed will I give this land" (12:7).

In essence, the Abrahamic Covenant is summed up in two planks of the platform God built for Abraham (Abram at that point, until his name is changed to Abraham, the "father of the faithful") and his posterity.

The two planks in the platform are as follows:

1. SOIL: The covenant guaranteed Abraham all the land from the river of Egypt to the Euphrates, the great Fertile Crescent (Gen. 15:18).

2. SEED: Even more important was the promise that Abraham's seed would be preserved, which in the end would produce the Messiah, Jesus Christ (Gen. 15:1-5). Observe that the true Seed of Abraham is Jesus, as seen in Matthew's genealogy (Matt. 1:1) where the Saviour's lineage traces Him back to Abraham through David in the tribe of Judah. Supportive verses concerning who the Seed is and from whom He will descend are Genesis 17:19 and Genesis 21:12.

The New Testament commentary is found in Galatians 3:16: "Now to Abraham and his seed were the promises made. He saith not, And to seeds, as of many; but as of one, And to thy seed which is Christ. " Also in the New Testament are the two genealogical records found in Matthew 1 and Luke 3, both of which connect Jesus with Abraham. What Kind of Man Was Abraham?

One of the most unique characters in the history of the Bible, Abraham is the only man in the Holy Writ who is called "the Friend of God" (II Chron. 20:7; Isa. 41:8; Jas. 2:23).

Such a man not only made an impact on his own generation, but he also influenced the lives and thinking of men in every generation following his sojourn on earth. On every continent the story of Abraham and his adventurous life has been told. People north, south, east, and west on both sides of the equator have called him blessed of God. The man of faith has become a model for many who wish, as he did, to please God.

The most admirable characteristic of this man was his ardent faith in God. This faith was gallantly demonstrated when he was childless. The Lord came and promised him a son in his old age when both he and Sarai were beyond the age of childbearing. But when God assured him that his heir (Isaac) would come out of his loins, the Scripture says, "And he believed in the Lord; and he counted it to him for righteousness" (Gen. 15:6).

What faith, what stamina, what courage Abraham displayed at this very trying time in his life! Little wonder the Holy Spirit inspired Paul to write a commentary in the New Testament extolling the faith of this great hero: "For what saith the scripture? Abraham believed God, and it was counted unto him for righteousness" (Rom. 4:3).

Abraham's unshakable faith should inspire each of us to exercise an unflinching faith in God, whose promises never fail!



The entire world has heard about the catastrophic earthquake that shook Port au Prince, Haiti, claiming more than 200,000 victims and leaving the nation's capitol in rubble. "But thou, O Daniel, shut up the words, and seal the book, even to the time of the end: many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall be increased." (Daniel 12:4.) The fact that knowledge is being rapidly increased gives us abundant evidence of accuracy and fulfillment of Bible prophesy.

The Jacques Alexandres, veteran missionaries to Haiti, lost their house in the earthquake. We had the privilege of having the Alexandres stay in our home for a couple of weeks while they regrouped. Jacques would say, "I can still feel the ground shaking under my feet." Although they were shaken, their faith remained steady.

Jacques' old SUV got smashed in the earthquake by falling concrete. They were able to drive it from Haiti to our house in the Dominican Republic, and we were able to get it repaired. While in an auto parts store, we took the opportunity to witness to five Dominican muchachos working behind the counter. One of them seemed pretty "shaken-up" over the recent earthquake. They all began to ask questions. One of them shook his head and asked, "Why did God allow this to happen?" After talking to them we discovered that they

were all new believers in the Lord. We explained to them that it is not wrong to have honest questions. In fact the Bible teaches us that "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge..." (Hosea 4:6a.) Then we all read Matthew 24, where Jesus was sitting upon the Mount of Olives, listening to the questions of the disciples. The disciples were shaken up and wanted to know the signs of His second coming. Jesus said, "And ye shall hear of wars and rumors of wars: see that ve be not troubled: for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not vet... and there shall be famines. pestilences, and earthquakes." The boys were all encouraged, and even want to start a church in their area. Jacques and I went on our way rejoicing.

"...Yet once more I shake not the earth only, but also heaven. And this word, Yet once more, signifieth the removing of those things that are shaken, that those things which cannot be shaken remain." (Hebrews 12:26.) There are certain things that cannot be shaken.

There is God. Our omnipotent Lord cannot be shaken under any circumstance. When everything is shaking around us and under us and our foundations are crumbling, there is the Lord, who cannot be shaken. He is our refuge and strength in times of trouble. God's Word says that every mountain and every island shall be moved one day. But God Himself is unshakable.

His holiness is unshakable. Holiness is the crown jewel of all His attributes. It is His holiness that reveals to us to us our sinfulness. He is holy in all His works. Revelation presents God as three times holy, "...Holy, holy, holy Lord God Almighty, which was, and is, and is to come." (Revelation 4:8.) He is holy in His Fatherhood, His Sonship, and the Holy Spirit. His holiness never changes.

Another thing that cannot be shaken is God's Word. "Forever, O lord, thy word is settled in heaven." Men have tried to change it, improve it, and even destroy it. Eternal life itself is dependent upon this indestructible and incorruptible Book, "Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth forever." (I Peter 1:22.) Someone said that men don't reject the Bible because it contradicts itself but because it contradicts them.

Then there is the unshakable mercy of God. "O give thanks unto the Lord; for His mercy endureth forever." Why can't His mercy be shaken? Because mercy is an enduring attribute of God, and God Himself cannot be shaken. All of His attributes for that matter. His love, grace, mercy, righteousness, holiness are multifaceted moral attributes of God that cannot be shaken. When we were unlovable, His unshakable love loved us, and He poured His love in our hearts. "... because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us." (Romans 5:5b.) When we get shaken up, He provides more grace. "For all things are for your sakes, that the abundant grace might through the thanksgiving of many redound to the glory of God." (2 Corinthians 4:15.) When Paul and Silas were in prison, it was an earthquake that released them. "And suddenly, there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed." (Acts16:26.) When we deserved Hell, His enduring mercy came to the rescue. When we did not deserve Heaven, His unshakable grace made the difference.

We still feel the island shaking from time to time, and though the islands shall be moved, there are still some things that cannot be shaken.
