ANOTHER GREAT YEAR OF PROGRESS!

Dear Co-laborers,

Church Activities - The last pastor's breakfast was held on December 9th with 23 pastors and missionaries present. The annual calendar for 2018 was set up which includes the conferences, camps, graduations, and youth and adolescent activities for the year.

Diana organized the last Ladies Fellowship for the year and had 33 present from 5 of the churches here in Manaus. They raised an offering to help send kids from needy families to youth camp next year.

Construction Projects - The glass is in the windows at the Purupuru congregation. Only 3 panes did not make the 60-mile trip interior and will be set this month. Missionary Marcílio has advanced on the building at Cumati (850 miles upriver); it will be used for the first Bible institute in that region.

Conferences - The organizational conference of the Missionary Baptist Church went well with 180 in attendance on Saturday night and 124 on Sunday; I challenged the new church to focus on molding their church to the New Testament model in the Scriptures. There were many visitors, and I expect that this church will grow quickly.

The anniversary conference of the 26 of November Baptist Church (23 years organized) went very well with over 140 in attendance on Saturday night. Diana and I built this church from February 1987 through November 1994.

Bela Vista Baptist Church also celebrated their annual conference with almost 200 in attendance. We began this work in 1994 and turned it over to national leadership in 2004.

Bible Institute - We had three graduates from the Bible institute here in Manaus (IBBA) on December 2nd. Elionai is from a town on the lower Amazon River, and Renã and Jackson are from Manaus. We had 17 students this semester and have some very promising young men and women continuing next semester, along with some new prospects for next March. We launched a new program from the IBBA that will take the teaching into the local churches two nights a week. Our first task is to train Sunday School teachers and to equip the church for the children outreach programs.

Missionaries - Missionary Valmir arrived December 5th from the São Gabriel area. He cares for The Baptist Church on the Rock (690 miles upriver) and travels the Rio Negro and tributaries evangelizing, and helps the local churches with their building programs. He is in town to receive a 40 H.P. outboard for his new wooden canoe, which will make his trips much easier and much more efficient. He was using 2 tiny 5.5 H.P. motors and was barely able to "pass" the rapids. Due to a very generous offering from a couple in the U.S., he has a good used motor. He is very happy, needless to say; the last trip that took 24 hours, will only take 7 now; and he will save on fuel (US\$ 6.21 a gallon).

Missionary Marcílio called and told of his trips evangelizing the Warekena people in Brazil and Venezuela; it was very encouraging to hear how God is blessing.

Thank You - We really appreciate each and every one who has prayed faithfully and given generously to our family and ministry here in the Amazon. We count it a privilege to represent you and to be co-laborers with you in this great work. It is a joy this Christmas season to share the good news of our Savior's birth with the Brazilian people, in the cities, towns, communities, and villages scattered over this great basin; your prayers and finances are proclaiming "glad tidings of great joy to all people." Thank you for standing with us!



PRACTICAL PRIORITIES FOR PREACHERS

During my sixty-seven years in the ministry, I have learned some things about preachers. Let me share some of these things with you.

WHAT IS A PREACHER?

The preacher is a person, a prince, a pattern, a propagator, a provoker, a preserver, a persuader. He is a real live human being, not a creation from another planet, or a super human, or a miracle worker.

He belongs to the **"Ten F Club"**: Fervent, fearless, forceful, flexible, fruitful, friendly, firm, frank, frugal, and faithful.

(Why will a preacher tell the congregation, "Well, I am no preacher," and then spend an hour and a half proving it?)

WHAT KIND OF PREACHER IS GOD LOOKING FOR?

- 1. A preacher who tarries long in the closet and stands tall in the pulpit.
- 2. A preacher whose faith has been fortified with a new fervor.
- 3. A preacher who persistently looks for unsaved souls and patiently waits for the Saviour.
- 4. A preacher who fervently preaches the truth without fear or favor.
- 5. A preacher who faithfully declares the unsearchable riches of grace and forcefully denounces the sins that nailed Jesus to the cross.
- 6. A preacher who clearly points multitudes to Jesus and compassionately pleads for men to stay out of hell.
- (J. Frank Norris said, "I would do anything to keep a man out of hell.")

MISCELLANEOUS MUSINGS FOR PREACHERS TO CONSIDER

• A preacher of the Word does not deal in trends, taboos, fads, fashions, or fairy tales: he deals in the unfiltered, uncompromising, unadulterated *truth* as he proclaims the gospel of redeeming grace.

• Any preacher who casts a shadow of doubt upon the veracity, the historicity, the accuracy, the authority, the authenticity, or the infallibility of the Word of God should leave the ministry and quit masquerading as a messenger of the most-high God.

• Preachers should get back to preaching the Word of God in the *Spirit* of God to glorify the *Son* of God and edify the *people* of God. Quit giving "fireside chats" and get back to "hell-fire preaching," quoting "Thus saith the Lord." (This phrase, or its equivalent, concerning God speaking, is used 3,800 times in the Bible.) Find yourself a few phrases!

• Preacher, when the thrill turns to a chill, you are over the hill and ready for a spill!

• Sound *words* plus sound *doctrine* make a sound *preacher*, and sound *preaching* leaves the audience with sound *faith*.

• Some preachers spend more time *analyzing* than agonizing, more time *elevating* self than exalting the Saviour, more time *philosophizing* than preaching, more time *entertaining* than interceding, and more time *exercising* than evangelizing.

REV. R.J. BARBER, JR., WITH THE LORD

Rev. R. J. Barber, Jr., brother of Dr. Raymond Barber, died Saturday, February 10, 2018, at his home in Danville, Virginia, after a brief period of declining health.



He founded Worth Baptist Church in Fort Worth, Texas, in 1954. Upon the death of Dr. R.J. Baber, Sr., founder and pastor of the Baptist Tabernacle in Danville, Virginia, Rev. R.J. Barber, Jr. became the pastor of the Baptist Tabernacle. Dr. Raymond Barber became the pastor of the Worth Baptist Church, Fort Worth, Texas in January 1962.

Rev. R.J. Barber, Jr. expanded the daily radio program his father had begun and conducted the last fifty-eight years. This April, the daily radio broadcast would have celebrated its eighty-sixth year of broadcasting, making it the longest daily religious radio broadcast in the world.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS NEW SEMESTER

Annual Founder's Week with our Chancellor, Dr. Raymond Barber, will be March 20-23. The students will enjoy a Mission Conference week with a theme, a daily mission's preacher and missionaries presenting their field. The dates for this are still being worked out. This semester's Week of Concentrated Study will be April 9-12 (Monday through Thursday), and will be a focus related to the first semester's of the Biblical account of creation and Noah's flood.

The students will have hands on teaching by the conducting of an excavation of dinosaur footprints on the Paluxy River under the direction of Dr. Carl Baugh of the Creation Evidence Museum of Glen Rose, Texas. Obviously they are excited about the possibilities of this venture! (The two previous school year's Week of Concentrated Study were on church planting stateside and then on the foreign field. We typically alternate between the practical and the theological each year.)

FOUNDING PASTORS AND FAITHFUL ALUMNI



Bro. James Pointer recently retired from the pastorate of Sioux City Baptist Church, of Sioux City, Iowa. Bro. Pointer graduated from the Bible Baptist Seminary of Ft. Worth, Texas, in 1970. He and his wife moved to Sioux City in 1974 to begin their ministry at Sioux City Baptist Church.

Bro. Pointer pastored the church for 43 years. I had the privilege of preaching for Bro. Pointer through the years on several occasions. He has been a personal friend and encourager for quite some time. Bro. Pointer and the church in Sioux City, have been steady supporters of NBBS. More recently, he stepped up to undergird the endeavors of the seminary, as we sought to refurbish the facilities that house the school.

Bro. Lowell Spencer, a graduate of the Bible Baptist Seminary in 1958, retired in January, from the pastorate of the Eaton Baptist Temple, Eaton, Ohio (pastored from 1966 to 2018!). Here is another very good friend through the years to the seminary, as well as to me personally.



Bro. Spencer and the Eaton Baptist Temple often sent the first check we would get in the mail when we were initiating a fund drive for the enhancement or repair of the school facilities. Oftentimes there would be a check from the church and one from him and his wife. We traveled to the Holy Land together in September of 2001.

We hope both Bro. Pointer and Bro. Spencer will be able to come our way next fall during the school year, and personally invest some "hands on time" preaching and/or teaching with the seminary for a few days. These two men, their wives, and their churches **will be having fruit credited to** their account until the Lord returns by way of all the students who were trained at NBBS these thirty-four years and who have "stayed by the stuff." They will also have a part in the future students God sends to the seminary. In the past three and a half years, many have stepped up to dramatically help the school resurge.

BIBLE COURSES ARE FRONT AND CENTER WITH DOCTRINAL AND PRACTICAL CLASSES FOLLOWING CLOSE BEHIND

Envision a preacher training center wherein 24 of the 48 classes are Bible exposition courses. The books of the Bible are taught in the order in which they are found in the Bible. Also, there are 10 doctrinal courses and 14 practical ones either on church-based ministry, or about how to live the Christian life. Additionally, consider that it has a faculty made up of preachers and their wives, who inherently bring "real life" experience into everything they teach. Consider that a semester goes a full 17 weeks, **so that a student by way of the four year program, receives up to 24 more weeks of instruction than they would in most Bible colleges. That, in effect, is nearly a whole year more of teaching!** All this, and so much more, at a cost below most other schools, is what NBBS is about.

We are still training preachers today! I highly recommend the Norris Bible Baptist Seminary to anyone who feels the call of God to "PREACH THE WORD."
