



PERSONAL RECOLLECTIONS

It was my privilege to sit at the feet of the great preacher, Dr. J. Frank Norris, not only as a student in the Bible Baptist Seminary, housed at that time (1950-1952) in the facilities of the historic First Baptist Church of Fort Worth, Texas, but also as a member of this

In the Seminary chapel services, we Bible school students heard the "Man Among Men" lecture on any given book of the Bible, especially the prophecy books, namely Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Daniel. Without notes, Dr. Norris would take us through these books naming all the kings, the prophecies of the end times, listing dates and events such as the captivities of the Northern Kingdom (Israel, the ten tribes) and the Southern Kingdom (Judah, the two tribes),

Who could forget how Dr. Norris discoursed on the lives and times of Tiglath-pileser, Shalmaneser, Sennacherib, Sargon, and Nebuchadnezzar? Graphic were his descriptions of the Assyrian Captivity of the Northern Kingdom under Shalmaneser V and Sargon II in 721 B.C. (a captivity from which Israel never returned). He lectured also on the Babylonian Captivity of the Southern Kingdom under Nebuchadnezzar in 606 B.C., 597 B.C., and 586 B.C., at which time Jerusalem was destroyed, the Temple of Solomon was burned, and the people were taken to Babylon



Bible Baptist Seminary student body – 1948 was used of God to expose

liberalism among Baptists, not only in the south, but across America.

MISCELLANEOUS RECOLLECTIONS

Saved at age thirteen, Norris was later baptized by Rev. Catlett Smith, who prayed this prayer over him:

"Dear Lord, take him, break him, and make him"

Dr. Norris' response many years later was, "I didn't mind the taking and the making, but I was not willing for the breaking." At age fifteen, Norris was shot by cattle thieves while he was trying to protect his alcoholic father. Soon afterward, he was given up by his doctor to die. **BUT GOD** (one of his favorite sayings) answered his mother's prayers.

Near the close of his life, the man of "velvet and steel" said:

"If I could roll back the years, I would pray more;

I would study my Bible more. and I would win more souls to Jesus Christ.'

At the time Norris said this, he was pastoring two great churches: the First Baptist Church, Fort Worth, Texas, and the Temple Baptist Church. Detroit, Michigan. He was also editing a weekly paper, the Fundamentalist, building a great school, the Bible Baptist Seminary, and traveling across America and to many parts of the world preaching the gospel.



While I was up north for the 35th Semi-Annual IBFI Meeting October 9-11, 2018, hosted by the historic Cornerstone Baptist

Church of Dayton, Ohio, the Norris Bible Baptist Seminary in Ft. Worth, was conducting the Week of Concentrated Study, as it does once every semester.

Pastor Jerry Siler of the Cornerstone Baptist Church, his staff, and church members, ministered to all present beyond what could rightly be expected. The spirit of the church and her staff was warm and readily helpful all week. The music that the church presented in various formats was all very uplifting and substantive in message. The meals provided daily at lunch time were exceptionally good and of great variety. The preaching by the "fathers of the IBFI movement" (the "Pauls"), as well as by the Tituses and Timothys, along the theme of "On A Mission!" was right on track in content, tone and focus. NBBS alumni were a major part of the program. The offering goal of \$35,000.00 (in keeping with our 35th year and in view of the current operational expenses of IBFI ministries), which I am sure will be met by the time you read this Searchlight edition!

Bro. Andrew Johnson, Music Director at Worth Baptist Church of Ft. Worth, Texas, and a PCC graduate with a Pastoral Ministry minor, as well as a longstanding faculty member of NBBS, did an outstanding job presenting the study of the great hymns of the faith as an indispensable part of our heritage. Students communicated to me throughout the week how much they enjoyed his teaching. From handouts



to lectures supported by video presentations, and actually singing some of the great hymns as a large choir, he more than accomplished our objectives for the week.

A GREAT SEMESTER (AS WELL AS THE PAST FOUR YEARS)!

The spirit of the student body continues to be high. We ended up enrolling 61 students for the fall semester, which ties the highest number in the 35 year history the school, and we have several new prospective students (as well as those who attended in the recent past) for the spring semester. God continues to bless in every area of the seminary's operation. Funds continue to come in for the remaining special projects that will complete our four-year effort to get the facilities fundamentally back to their proper condition. We will very soon be able to replace the old heating and A/C system on the school side, as we are within \$3,500 of the needed funds

We will move forward with the other four projects as the funds come in for them. They are the finishing of the outside safety/security lighting (\$2,500); the patching and re-striping of the two parking lots (\$6,500); the resealing of the 94 windows to prevent the leakage we always get on whatever side the wind blows in the rain in especially stormy weather conditions (\$10,000), and finally finishing the three phase strategy for new floor covering with new carpet on the office side (\$15,000). Upon the completion of these four projects, we will finally be at a small projects maintenance mode on the main building.

From repairing the outside sprinkler systems, redeveloping the berms, replacing the 900' fencing, and securing commercial grade lawn equipment, to manifold building repairs and needed remodeling, to securing new inside furnishings for classroom, chapel and office operations, to addressing numerous items concerning the dormitory, we have seen God provide some \$250,000 in a little over four years! Thank you to the many who have allowed God to be such a blessing to the students and the cause of Christ through the IBFI ministries.

A GREAT SEASON!

The Doctrine of Christ (Christology) is the central course at the school around which all the other courses rightly revolve (in conjunction with Bible Doctrine I - Theology Proper), and it is particularly our focus this time of the year. Late November into December, finds us not only thankful for the religious freedoms we enjoy because of forefathers like the "Pilgrims of 1620," but even more so for the coming of the eternal Son of God in the flesh.

The first chapel after the Sunday that follows Thanksgiving, finds us exclusively singing songs on the significance of the incarnation of God in the flesh in chapel! Lyrics like, "Without reluctance, flesh and blood His substance, He took the form of man, revealed the hidden plan, O glorious mystery, sacrifice of Calvary, and now I know thou wert the great I Am," fill the air. The preaching is also largely in line with this emphasis.

We hope you had a great Thanksgiving, and that you have a very Merry Christmas and the best new year yet in your service for the Lord! "Thanks be unto God for His unspeakable gift."

The Apostle Paul said to Timothy, "I charge thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick and the dead at his appearing and his kingdom; 2Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine. 3For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; 4And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned
