
THE SMITH FAMILY MINISTRY IN RORAIMA, BRAZIL

November 16th, we traveled to Caracarai for the Ordination of 4 men to the Gospel Ministry. Rogerio was one of those men. Other Pastors came

and questioned these men, and then, all were ordained. Rogerio is pastoring one of our churches in Boa Vista. The Lord is blessing him and his wife Zipora. Please pray for all our pastors; they are having some hard times. The government is behind in paying salaries, so many are struggling financially. Some of the pastors must work, as well as, pastor their churches. Brazil has a new President. We pray there will be some good changes, and that God will bless this country.

Pastor Werlesson and the Manancial Baptist Church had a Mission Conference on the 24th of November and invited other churches to attend. This is the church plant that had been closed in 2015 and then re-opened in 2016. The church also had a baptismal service on December 2nd with 4 being baptized. The Pastor's daughter was one of the young ladies baptized. They are averaging around 20-25 in their services.







J. FRANK NORRIS: A MAN AMONG MEN A MEMORIAL TO DR. NORRIS

(Fifth in a Series)

> NORRIS—BARBER FAMILY RELATIONSHIP

The J. Frank Norris and Dr. R. J. Barber, Sr. families enjoyed a warm, personal, and cordial relationship

for many years. The accompanying photo of the Barber family was taken in December of 1951. Dr. Norris often expressed his affection for the Barbers.

Helen and I had an intimate relationship with Dr. Norris: He married us, reserved and financed our honeymoon at one of Fort Worth's most prestigious hotels of that day, the Blackstone Hotel, and furnished us his personal automobile. Dr. Norris, a great fisherman, invited us to a fish dinner at his home on Eagle Mountain Lake shortly after we were married. What a great experience and a privilege to sit at the table with America's foremost fundamentalist of the twentieth century.

Following are the members of the Barber family who attended the Bible Baptist Seminary, all of whom sat at Norris' feet in the Seminary classes, as well as under his dynamic preaching at First Baptist Church, Fort Worth, Texas: Raymond and Helen Barber, R. J. Barber, Jr. and Justine, Stanley and Edna (Barber) Knick, Doug and Mamie (Barber) Gregory, Jack and Virginia (Barber) Blankenship.

Notice also the picture of my dad, Dr. R. J. Barber, Sr., (left bottom row). Helen and I are pictured next to my dad. (Notice how thin I was!) On the back of the photo, a note is written: To be run in the Fundamentalist and school annual **by request of Dr. Entzminger.** The note is dated December 1951.



While the oldest of the Barber preachers, Bob, is now in Heaven, three of us (Bill, Doug, and I) continue to propagate Norris' influence in a combined ministry of one-hundred sixty-eight years, plus Dad's ministry of forty years, and Bob's ministry of seventy-two years—a grand total of two-hundred eighty years--extending the ministry and influence of the "man among men." To God be the glory!

DR. NORRIS' IMMEDIATE SUCCESSOR

Upon the death of Dr. Norris in 1952, the First Baptist Church called Dr. Homer Ritchie to succeed him. Homer, a warm and personal friend of mine for more than sixty years, pastored the historic church for more than thirtyOn Sunday, February 3, Homer went home to be with the Lord at age ninety-two after being in the ministry almost seventy-five years. His years at First Baptist Church were blessed of the Lord, and he being dead yet speaketh. Our prayers are with his wife, Brenda, and the Ritchie family.

This year we are celebrating the 35th ANNIVERSARY of the INDEPENDENT BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP INTERNATIONAL (IBFI). The IBFI was founded in 1984 under the leadership of Dr. Raymond W. Barber. The ministries of the IBFI are the Norris Bible Baptist

Seminary (NBBS), the IBFI Mission Agency and our publication, the Searchlight.

Even though we try to make our fellowship and ministries known, people are not familiar with the IBFI and its ministries. How can we make people more aware of these? One of the main ways is for IBFI pastors, churches, and missionaries to tell others about us. Word of mouth is personal, effective, and hard to beat.

Many times I have been invited to various meetings and have been exposed to what they are doing. I recall, twenty-three years ago, being invited to Mexico for the Mount Abarim Baptist Mission, International conference. During the conference we made a trip to Tlapa, Mexico, to visit the children's home. I discovered that I agreed with Mount Abarim's ministries. I led our church, Worth Baptist, to support their ministry. My wife and I personally became financial supporters. How did that happen? Someone invited me and I was exposed to a great ministry. Sometimes, it just takes our invitation for others to come to our national meetings, to visit the Seminary and chapel services, or to attend other activities we host. They may not be aware that there is a conservative fellowship that has a unique Seminary, that teaches the whole English Bible, and trains and prepares students for ministry. Our Seminary, has a great unity and is growing under the leadership of Dr. Jonathan Stewart.

If you are associated with the IBFI and its ministries, help get the word out to expose folks to what we have. A good way to do that would be to invite them to our next spring IBFI National meeting to be held, May 20-23, 2019, at the Raymond W. Barber Conference Center, Fort Worth, Texas. NBBS – OUR 35TH GRADUATION

35 YEARS THIS MAY,

THE NBBS WAS STARTED! The Norris Bible Baptist Institute was established in May of 1984, and began classes

in August of that same year, offering three year Bible Diplomas. In the early 2000s, NBBI became the Norris Bible Baptist Seminary. Accordingly, with the name change came an additional year of courses and the granting of a bachelor's degree in Biblical Studies, with three different potential minors (Pastoral, Missions, or Church Ministries) as well as master and doctoral degree programs going into effect in 2014.

SIX GRADUATES THIS MAY

We have five candidates for a bachelor's degree, and one for a one-year Bible certificate. The Bible certificate is characterized by twelve courses primarily in Bible and doctrine. It allows a student who is open to a call to the ministry to further seek God's leading. It is also a worthy endeavor for a church member who wants to better learn his Bible. Besides the benefit received from the classes, the student has a certificate to show for it. The presence of a few church members every year, enhances the education experience of the preachers who are in training, as they see church members who are also hungry to learn the Word of God. The interaction is beneficial to both.



Michael Bridges is securing a Bachelor of Biblical Studies with a Bible Major and a Pastoral Minor. He was a member of the Pensacola Baptist Temple, where Bro. Glen Anderson is pastor. While in school, he has been a member of the Victory Baptist Church of Weatherford, Texas, where Dr. Charles Wetherbee is

the pastor. Michael was a diligent student. He is married to Katherine, and they have two children.

Daniel Coates is a long-term missionary to Guatemala. Bro. Coates is another alumnus who graduated several years ago with the three-year Bible Diploma from the Norris Bible Baptist Institute. Because he took more than the 36 prescribed credits at NBBI when he was first a student, he was well on



his way toward a bachelor's degree when he decided to go ahead and secure it. At the tail end of his furlough last year, he took five classes at NBBS this past fall, while still visiting in churches on Sundays. Bro. Daniel will graduate with a Bachelor of Biblical of Studies with a Bible Major and a Missions Minor. He is married to Tammy, and they have ten children. The oldest is a student at NBBS. He will be returning from the field for a few days in May to receive his degree in person.



David Grice is the founder and pastor of the Lighthouse Baptist Church, Grand Prairie, Texas. He returned as a student at NBBS, in order to secure a four-year Bachelor of Biblical Studies with a Bible Major and Pastoral Minor. Bro. David is yet another alumnus who graduated several years ago with the three-year Bible

Diploma from the Norris Bible Baptist Institute. He had taken took more than the 36 prescribed courses at NBBI when he was first a student, so was well on his way toward a bachelor's degree when he decided to go ahead and secure it. Bro. Grice has been a faculty member at NBBS for several years, and is presently serving on the IBFI Board of Directors. He remained an active teacher at the seminary while taking classes. Bro. David is also the president of the IBFI of the Great Southwest. He is married to Angela, and they have four children. Bro. Grice has played a very significant role in the resurgence of NBBS in various ways of involvement.

Kenneth Ralph, was the youth director for six years at Maranatha Baptist Church, Columbus Georgia, where alumnus Mark Brown is the pastor. He came to NBBS to finish his degree, and was with us three years. While at NBBS, he has been the youth director at First Baptist Church of Cottondale, Paradise, Texas. Bro. Charles Pugh

is the pastor. Bro. Ralph has been an outstanding student, and a very positive force at the seminary. He was one of those students who was more than "a student." He is receiving a Bachelor of Biblical Studies with a Bible Major and a Pastoral Minor. Bro. Kenneth is married to Kristy, and they have five children. After graduation, Bro.
