he progression of our witness for Christ in Acts 1:8 has a very definite progression-beginning in ourhome town Jerusalem, we then move on to the rest of our country, Judaea. The progression ends withthe uttermost part of the earth. Christ is Savior, and "all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God." Isaiah 52:10. God used the Prophet Isaiah to declare the effectiveness of His Word. It is written in Isaiah 55:9-11. The focal point is verse 11:

"So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereunto

I sent it."

When I was a student in the Bible Baptist Seminary seventy years ago, Dr. J. Frank Norris said to us young students:

"Interpret Scripture by Scripture: God's Word means everything; our words mean nothing."

John Jay, the first justice of the United States Supreme Court, said:

"The Bible is the best of all books, for it is the Word of God and teaches us the way to be happy in this world and the next; continue therefore to regulate your life by its precepts."

Every message preached should be based on the Word of God and designed to glorify Christ. Any message that it not embedded in the Word of God and focused on Jesus Christ is not worthy of being preached.

There are three kinds of preachers: (1) Those to whom you **cannot** listen; (2) Those to whom you **can** listen; (3) Those to whom you **must** listen.

FIVE THINGS THAT WILL HAPPEN WHEN THE WORD OF GOD IS PREACHED

One: When the Word of God is preached, light penetrates a world steeped in darkness:

• Psalm 119:130—"The entrance of thy words giveth light."

Two: When the Word of God is preached, cleansing is brought to unclean lives:

• John 15:3—"Ye are clean through the Word which I have spoken unto you."

Three: When the Word of God is preached, seed is planted that will bring forth the harvest in God's designated time.

• Matthew 9:37,38—"Then saith he to his disciples, the harvest truly is plenteous, but the laborers are few; pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth laborers unto his harvest."

(Do not forget whose harvest it is.)

Four: When the Word of God is preached, food is served that will nourish hungry hearts.

• Matthew 4:4—"Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." (Over 700,000 words came from the mouth of God to comprise the Bible, and every word is perfumed by the sweet aroma of heaven, and God does not have halitosis.)

Five: When the Word of God is preached, medicine is dispensed that will heal sick souls that are contaminated by the disease called sin.

• Psalm 107:20—"He sent his word and healed them."

A FINAL WORD

The consequences of sin are spelled out clearly in God's Word, and the preaching of the gospel produces the results that God designed it to produce. (Read again Isaiah 55:11.) In my sixty-eight years of preaching, I have learned that every time the Word of God is preached (irrespective of the preacher), something happens.

Look out, it is sure to happen!
