
CHAD FITTS - CHURCH PLANTER AND 2016 GRADUATE OF THE NORRIS BIBLE BAPTIST SEMINARY

ARTHUR BARNES HOUK JULY 24, 1929 - FEBRUARY 6, 2022

The world first laid eyes on Arthur Barnes Houk on July 24, 1929. Born in Doylestown, Pennsylvania, he grew to adulthood there. In the summer of 1946 as a Merchant Marine seaman, he signed on with the crew of the Villanova Victory to deliver cattle to Greece for Hefer International. Because of the danger of mines in the Mediterranean Sea left from World War II, he was considered a veteran of the war. After graduating from Doylestown High School in 1947, he enrolled in the Bible Institute of Los Angeles (now Biola University) at the behest of his cousin Chuck. Bible was not his real interest; it was the allure of Southern California. However, shortly after becoming a student he put his faith in Jesus Christ for his eternal salvation. Several years later he graduated with a Bachelors degree and a new wife. On December 22, 1950 Arthur married Shirley Chambers, a Biola graduate from Ohio. They were a couple until she passed away November, 2016. After graduation in 1952

he became the pastor of the First Baptist Church of Clarkston, Washington. For more than six decades he pastored churches from Southern California to Alaska and from Miami to New York City, and points in between.

After serving for almost fifteen years as the pastor of Arden Faith Baptist Church in Colville, he retired at the age of 91, and moved to Brooklyn to live with one of his daughters. In addition to his regular church ministries, he preached in the Stevens County jail several times a week, gave a five-minute Gospel message Monday through Saturday on Radio Station WCZL, and sent frequent letters-to-the-editor of local

Arthur is survived by his five children: Ruth Christopher (Stephen), Brooklyn, NY; David Houk (Cathy), Tempe, AZ; Deborah Clary (Glenn), Lynchburg, VA; Daniel Houk, Palos Verdes Estates, CA, and Jonathan Houk (Christine), Marietta, GA. In addition, he has twelve grandchildren and fourteen great-grandchildren.

Arthur loved the Lord and left generous gifts to many Missionaries including IBFI Missionaries. His ministry to our Lord Jesus Christ continues today through these missionaries and the many lives of those he impacted with the Gospel.

Dr. Shipman, a faithful servant of the Lord Jesus Christ, went home to be with the Lord quietly and peacefully on Saturday afternoon, April 2, 2022, in Dallas, Texas, after an extended illness. Orphaned at the age of nine, Don was raised by

his older brother, Ralph, and sister-in-law, Irene. At age fourteen, Don heard the Gospel of Christ, and accepted Him as his personal Lord and Savior. At seventeen years old, he surrendered his life to the Lord and the Gospel ministry. Soon after, he moved to Fort Worth, Texas, where he enrolled in the Bible Baptist Seminary. While ministering in music at Central Baptist Church in Bowie, Texas, he saw a pretty young lady at the piano. He leaned over to a friend, and said, "I'm going to marry that girl." A little over a year later, Don and Elvena were married. Together, they ministered in churches all over America for sixty-two years. Don's ministry spanned over a period of almost seventy years.



Don was on the frontline of the organization of the dependent Baptist Fellowship International and ne Norris Bible Baptist Seminary. He served on several boards through the following years. He and his family were faithful in all phases of the fellowship's ninistries. The Lord used him and his family in preaching and in the music. Who could forget "Ship

Ahoy" as only Don Shipman could sing it? His faithfulness to Christ and his dedication to the ministry, will continue to impact people long after his death. To God be the glory!

A GREAT MAY **FELLOWSHIP MEETING!**

The 2022 IBFI May Fellowship was, in my estimation, one of the best May fellowship meetings I have attended, and I have been attending them since the spring of 1992.

The preaching was great, the spirit was encouraging, and the fellowship was sweet. Bro. Kevin Folger did a fantastic job Monday night and Tuesday morning. It was so encouraging to witness nine graduates walk the platform on Tuesday evening for the graduation ceremonies.

The offering for the IBFI May Fellowship on Wednesday morning went great. Our goal was \$60,000.00, and within 15 minutes we raised over \$70,000.00! Since then, more offerings have been given and, with the promise of offerings to come, the total will exceed \$80,000.00. Praise the Lord!

The combined Wednesday night service was held at Victory Baptist Church, in Weatherford, Texas. People overflowed into the balcony from the floor level. There was great congregational singing and uplifting special music, as well as two impactful sermons from Bro. Larry McKinney (missionary to the North American Indians), and Bro. Tyler Gillit, pastor of Worth Baptist Church, Fort Worth, Texas, preached in the place of Dr. Raymond Barber, who was unable to attend.



The selling and purchasing of property and land continues to move forward. Though sometimes it moves slower than I had hoped for, it is all in God's timing. We do now have a contract on the selling of our properties and buildings. We also have a contract on the purchase of a little over 8 acres, not more than 10 minutes from our current location. The two contracts are in the "Due Diligence Period" which affords us the opportunity to test and examine the possibility of building our new facility. If we find that the property is going to require more preparation work than we can afford, we can back out of the contract with no money loss and look at selling just our vacant land and remodeling and expanding the Conference Center at our current location to largely match what we would build on a new property.

The Norris Bible Baptist Seminary needs more space as we go forward, so please continue to pray for God's direction.


FOR SUCH A TIME AS THIS
